### Footnotes

We did not have any bills passed during this 2020 legislative session. It is the Public Policy Committee's opinion that the COVID-19 Virus played a role in preventing these bills from passage. The Budget was in the Senate when the virus broke out. Three health-related laws that will have statewide impact include HB 135 - will allow physician assistants to prescribe controlled substances (already possible in every other state), SB 50 gives the Executive Branch more direct control of Medicaid's pharmacy program, and HB 129 will re-focus health departments on their core mission while re-allocating money in more rural areas.

A one-year budget passed on April 1<sup>st</sup> prior to adjournment. The Legislative Session will reconvene at 12:00 on Monday, April 13, 2020. The one year budget means that we look ahead to 2021. This is an election year so we need to contact the candidates. Thanks to everyone for all your hard work.
